2018 Lobby Day

This year's New York Farm Bureau Lobby Day is Tues., Mar. 6. Members of the board will be attending Lobby Day to meet with our local representatives as well as adopted representatives to discuss NYFB's priorities for the upcoming year. These include such issues as requesting to double the minimum wage tax credit for farms in order to help offset some of the increase in the minimum wage and securing state funding for critical farm programs that support research, technical assistance and promotion of the diverse commodities grown in the state. NYFB is pleased to see that Governor Cuomo continues to make strides in state procurement efforts and support for marketing programs like Taste NY. His latest budget ask includes \$10 million in the education budget to expand the school lunch reimbursement program for districts who purchase at least 30% of their food that is grown, produced or processed in New York. The reimbursement rate would jump from \$0.06 per meal to \$0.25 per meal. The final top priority is a new policy put forth at December's State Annual Meeting which supports efforts to combat tick-borne diseases like Lyme disease. NYFB is supportive of increasing funding for both enhanced detection and vaccine development.

Silver Key Awards

Washington County Farm Bureau was presented with eight Silver Key Awards at the New York Farm Bureau State Annual Meeting, held Dec. 5-6 in Albany, NY. The Silver Key Awards are presented to county Farm Bureaus that have exhibited excellence in a variety of categories relating to effectiveness in policy implementation, promoting agriculture among the public and in classrooms, leadership development and membership building. The awards were presented to county Farm Bureau for excellence in the following categories: Membership; Agricultural Promotion and Education; County Financials; Information and Public Relations; Leadership Development; Policy Implementation—Local; Policy Implementation—State and National; and Young Farmers. In addition, Washington County Farm Bureau President, Patricia Lockwood from Hudson Falls, was recognized with the Distinguished President Award for overall county Farm Bureau programming.

While at the State Annual Meeting, farmer members also took part in the grassroots process of laying the groundwork for the year ahead. More than 150 delegates from across New York proposed, discussed and voted on resolutions that will guide NYFB's public policy agenda for 2018.

Trivia Night Recap

Washington County Farm Bureau hosted its second annual trivia night, a fundraiser for local FFA chapters to attend the State and National FFA conventions. The event was held on Fri., Nov. 10 and was attended by over 135 people from the

agricultural and non-agricultural community in Washington and Saratoga Counties. The evening featured dinner catered by D J Herrington followed by trivia. Thanks to generous local sponsorship and event participants, Washington County Farm Bureau was able to raise \$3,000 for FFA chapters in Washington County and Schuylerville FFA in Saratoga County. Over the two year history, the event has raised \$4,800 in total.
