Dear Fellow Farm Bureau Members, Farm Bureau: Now More than Ever!

Hopefully we have seen the last of winter. As everyone in production agriculture is facing depressed commodity prices it is ever more important to come together and compose a viable solution. Farm Bureau is the platform that will bring producers together. If there is someone in your community that is in production agriculture and complaining about low prices, please ask them to join Farm Bureau or send me their name and number. We need everyone on board to put the common sense ideas of our members into forming the next Farm Bill.

Recently I had the privilege of being part of a conference call with AFBF president, Zippy Duvall, along with all of the county presidents throughout New York. His main message was just that, Farm Bureau members across the country need to and will be shaping the core of the next farm bill. The main points will be the obvious ones, trade and immigration. He is quite confident we will have a trade agreement with Mexico and Canada in place soon and that President Trump is going to make sure it's the one American farmers have been waiting for. On immigration, he said they are working toward an H2A program that works for Dairy farms.

Farm Bureau membership numbers in New York have been decreasing for a few years now. There has recently been a new statewide committee formed called the "Enhanced Membership Committee". Ben Hollamby of Portville will be representing District 1 on this special committee, it's main focus is on the current dues structure and looking at any potential opportunities for the future.

Please take notice of the information in this newsletter concerning Ag Trivia Night. This again will be a funfilled evening geared toward raising money for our county's future farmers. We hope to see you there!

NYFB 2018 State Priority Issues

These are the issues that people were discussing with legislators at Lobby Days.

- Support funding for critical food safety, animal health, and agricultural promotion and economic development programs in the Agriculture and Markets budget
- Double the minimum wage tax credit for farmers starting in 2018
- Support for funding of Environmental Protection Fund programs that provide cost-sharing of critical farm water quality and farmland protection projects that allow farms to reinvest in their farm business
- Cornell College of Ag & Life Sciences Capital Fund
- Oppose unworkable farm labor mandates and make much needed updates and reforms to NYS labor laws and regulations
- Transfer farm tax assessment functions from the Department of Taxation & Finance to the Department of Ag & Markets
- Increase school reimbursements to incentivize the purchase of fresh and minimally processed local food
- Allow for the registration of UTVs for legal travel on roads from farm to field
- Increase funding for tick-borne disease enhanced detections and vaccine development
- Support the removal of acreage requirement for farms in the agricultural assessment program as long as they meet income eligibility requirements.
