Farmers from all over the state – and from all types of agriculture- come to represent all of us.

And everyone has a "first time". The NYFB staff and the experienced members make it easy. Just follow the crowd the first time. You will see it is not intimidating- it is empowering, enlightening, and-yes- even fun!

On February 27<sup>th</sup> you will drop your stuff off at the hotel and then head to the Empire State Plaza where there will be a question and answer session, usually with the commissioners of agriculture, labor, and the DEC. **Dear Fellow Farm Bureau Members:** Hello all, my name is Michael Telaak and I am very excited to have the privilege of being the new president of the Cattaraugus County Farm Bureau. I have been a member of Farm Bureau for many years now and am honored to be stepping up to take on this role. Alongside my father, uncle, and sister, I own and help operate a small dairy farm right here in Mansfield NY. In addition to Farm Bureau, I am also a delegate for Upstate Farms, a board member on the Mansfield Town Board, and a member of our local volunteer Fire Department.

I grew up right here in Cattaraugus County, just outside of Ellicottville, on our family farm. After graduating high school, I ended up deciding to join the United States Air Force. During my time in the Airforce, I had the opportunity to be stationed around the world in Germany, Korea, Turkey and then Montana. After about 6 years of active-duty service, I transitioned to the Air Force Reserves, operating out of Niagara Falls Air Base. During that time is when I decided to go back to college at SUNY Morrisville for Dairy Animal Science, with the intention of coming back home to the farm after completing my studies. The completion of my degree ended up getting delayed by one semester though because I was deployed, through the Reserves, for a tour in Iraq. After returning from Iraq and finally completing my studies at Morrisville, I joined the family dairy farm and eventually worked into a partnership with my father and uncle.

Fast forward to today, my sister has also returned home to the farm, after a short career as a nurse, and has also joined me as a partner. We are currently milking 360 cows, utilizing 6 robotic milkers, growing and harvesting our own crops, and working around 1000 acres of ground. I am sincerely looking forward to working alongside our outstanding board here at Cattaraugus County Farm Bureau- and I look forward to having opportunities to get to know all our members better.

## Fighting for Ag in the Courtroom

Unfortunately, modern times have called for an additional forum in the fight for agriculture rights- the courts. Did you know that NYFB and AFBF have been battling in the courts over things like the ban on chlorpyrifos; the taking of land by flooding done by the Army Corps of Engineers; maintaining laws regarding illegal filming of farm activities by animal rights activists; and insisting on free speech and due process rights made clear for both farmers and workers regarding collective bargaining provisions within the Farm Laborers Fair Labor Practices Act. Also, unfortunately, court proceedings are expensive. NYFB has a legal defense fund specific to this purpose, but it is completely dependent on donations from people like you and our alliance members. # Attention High School Seniors! It's Scholarship Time!

#### March 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024 deadline

The NYFB scholarship application is currently available at NYFB.org. Applicants will compete to win a \$250 scholarship from Cattaraugus County Farm Bureau, a \$250 district level award, and on the state level NY Farm Bureau will be awarding one-time scholarships to the top two applicants statewide, \$3000 and \$2000. Applicant Guidelines:

- 2024 graduating high school senior who will continue their education to prepare for a career in some way connected to the diverse agricultural field.
- Live or work on a farm or be involved with agriculture via any avenue
- Family Farm Bureau Membership or Student Farm Bureau Membership is required.

Do you know of a 4-Her starting a new animal project or 4-H or FFA students going on a trip that would like a little financial boost? We want to help offset their costs! All ages are encouraged to apply!

The application requires your basic information, plus whatever farm/ agricultural experience you have and a 300-500 word essay. The essay must include what you want to use the money for, what you expect to gain from the experience, who sponsors the trip or activity, and what your total cost is for the trip or activity. In addition, you will need to include your involvement in agricultural, school, and community activities. You must have a Family or Student Cattaraugus County Farm Bureau Membership or be sponsored by a Cattaraugus County Farm Bureau member. All 4-Hers and FFA students are welcome to apply.
