A Fireside Chat with the County President

Dear Fellow Farm Bureau Members:

With this new year and the new year's spring planting almost upon us, it's a good time for us all to ask ourselves why. The why, in this case, is why Farm Bureau. Why are we a part of this organization, why do we take the time to pay our dues, read the newsletters, or go to community events like the Annual Farm Bureau picnic or (one of mine and my wife's personal favorites) Ag Trivia night? Why do any of this?

When I ask myself this question, my brain thinks both big picture and small. Attention 4-Hers and FFA Students



Do you know of a 4-Her starting a new animal project or 4-H or FFA students going on a trip that would like a little financial boost? We want to help offset their costs! All ages are encouraged to apply!

The application requires your basic information, plus whatever farm/ agricultural experience you have and a 300-500 word essay. The essay must include what you want to use the money for, what you expect to gain from the experience, who sponsors the trip or activity, and what your total cost is for the trip or activity. In addition, you will need to include your involvement in agricultural, school, and community activities. You must have a Family or Student Cattaraugus County Farm Bureau Membership or be sponsored by a Cattaraugus County Farm Bureau member. All 4-Hers and FFA students are welcome to apply.

Lobby Days 2024

This year's Lobby Days once again saw agriculturalists from all over the state descending on Albany for the Taste of NY reception, followed by a day of visiting legislators to tell them what farming is about and what we need from them to maintain our food, fiber, and fuel supply.

The hot topics to discuss with the legislators this year were maintaining funding for agricultural programs in the NYS budget; allowing direct to consumer shipping for all NY produced farm beverages; and asking legislators to find an alternative to the Extended Producer Responsibility Act, which would put the cost of recycling containers on the producer of the containers, rather than the consumer.
