### Oswego County Farm Bureau Policy Development Resolutions 2025

- We support New York Farm Bureau taking a more active role in sharing news items (via Grassroots and in e-media) about national and international issues effecting agriculture, regulatory environment/other grassroots farmer initiatives.
- We oppose solar companies including Non-Disclosure agreements in solar leases with farmers.
- We oppose legislation that would prohibit certain wild animals from being transported to fairs for educational exhibition.
- We support making the ST-125 Farmer's and Commercial Horse Boarding Operator's Exemption Certificate valid for 5 years.
- We oppose legislation that would require bottles, including wine bottles, to be refillable.
